Background & Context

Mental Health Statistics in Arizona:

- 40.8% of adults report symptoms of anxiety or depression (NAMI, 2021).
- 27.4% of those seeking mental health care were unable to access services.

Challenges and Impact of COVID-19:

- Increased prevalence of mental health issues.
- Impact on both adults and youth, necessitating urgent mental health support.

AZHIP Pandemic Recovery & Resilience

- Enhance resilience in Arizona communities
- Mental Health & Trauma Implementation Team

What is a Community of Practice?

Definition:

- A CoP is a collaborative network of peers with shared interests and expertise.
- Facilitates the exchange of explicit and implicit knowledge.

Purpose:

- To foster learning and proficiency through collaboration.
- Example: Professional networks, academic groups, and support organizations.

Benefits:

- Enhanced knowledge sharing.
- Increased capacity to address community needs.

Foundational Principles

Equity-Centered Approach:

- Focus on justice, fairness, and equal opportunities.
- Prioritizes inclusivity and addresses disparities based on race, gender, socioeconomic status, etc.

Place-Based Approach:

- Tailors strategies to the unique geographic and cultural context of a community.
- Ensures relevance and effectiveness of interventions.

Integrating Health Equity

We designed the playbook with a health literacy and health equity lens.


User-Friendly

- Using layperson language
- Providing an appendix with glossary of terms
- Use of images
- Giving step by step implementation
- Integrating case examples
- Linking directly to resources and training

Community Centered

- Opportunity to curate unique CoP based on diverse populations and individual community needs
- Co-created Playbook with community based organizations around Arizona
- Included resources on cultural sensitivity and relevance

Community Structure and Governance



Promoting Community Engagement

Techniques for Fostering Participation:

- Create a welcoming and inclusive environment.
- Use various communication channels (meetings, forums, social media).
- Encourage active involvement through collaborative projects and feedback loops.

Examples:

- Regular workshops and training sessions.
- Community events and information sessions.

Capacity Building and Training

Strategies for Enhancing Skills:

- Provide targeted training and resources based on community needs.
- Offer mentorship and peer learning opportunities.

Resources and Ideas for Trainings

Focus Areas:

- Trauma-informed care.
- Cultural competency.
- Effective communication and collaboration techniques.
- Data analysis and utilization for improved outcomes.

Data Collection and Evaluation

Possible Methods for Assessing Effectiveness of CoP:

- Collect quantitative and qualitative data on CoP activities and outcomes.
- Use surveys, interviews, and focus groups to gather feedback.
- Consider what equity means in the context of the CoP.

Examples of Metrics for Success:

- Improvement in mental health indicators.
- Increased community engagement and resource utilization.
- Increased CoP member diversity, engagement, and participation.
- Achievement of specific goals outlined in the playbook.

Sustainability and Future Directions

Strategies for Long-Term Impact:

- Develop a sustainability plan that can include funding, resource allocation, and leadership succession.
- Foster strong partnerships with other organizations and stakeholders.
- Continuously adapt and refine practices based on feedback and evolving needs.

Our Future Goals:

- Expand CoP initiatives across Arizona.
 - Provide support for new CoP creation.
- Dissemination of CoP Playbook through an open source formatting online
 - Quarterly AZ ACEs CoP meetings
